Hi Alan,

I am still considering whether to include a Waste Management Plan clause in the Section 106 agreement.

In your consultation response of July 2025, you calculated that total waste capacity required would be 2,520 litres and I will accept this on the basis that:

- i. The apartments (all but one) are single bedroom so it is unlikely that demand will exceed the calculated figure.
- ii. In the basement waste storage area, there isn't room for another Eurobin but they could without difficulty fit.

In short, I am happy that the storage space is adequate and I do not think that there is much danger of the owner overflowing.

The applicant has questioned the need for a Waste Management Plan, and I do not really want to include it if it does not.

I would welcome your thoughts on this.
