| <p><b>REFUGE COLLECTION AREA</b></p> <p>The plan of the emergency refuge collection area is bonkers I don't think I will be here to see it in general use. When I tell people of the plan they say if they had to take 3 bins to and from the area up and down the steep hill it would be a DEAL BREAKER. The bin area is just somewhere to put a site office and construction compound while the culvert, entrance road and retaining wall are built.</p> <p>Good luck with the bird as it will be right under the rookery.</p> <p>Consultee response ID 1094465. The bin store will get some use until the site is finished as Kirklees Council waste collection will not enter a site until construction has finished.</p> <p>Kirklees Council do not like people having to drag their bins more that 25m as they get left on the highway and footpaths creating a hazzard.</p> <p>At the moment houses have a green and grey bin emptied on alternate weeks and some houses also have a brown bin emptied every 2 weeks. There is talk of having a bin for food waste. This is a lot of bins to be wheeled from the top of the site and back again. Some houses have 4 bedrooms and may require more than 1 bin of a colour so 50 spaces is nowhere near adequate, with clashing bin days and extra bins from some houses.</p> <p>Such a large collection of bins is bound to attract foxes, , roe deer, rooks and vermin to potential food. What sort of mess will the bin men come to at 7am when they come to empty them. cannot tell the difference in the bins and will try to knock them all over.</p> <p>As usual the new information answers non of the old questions, it just poses new ones.</p> |    |
