

**Consultation Response from KC,
Trees****2025/91786 Brookside, 67, Hall Ing Lane, Honley, Holmfirth, HD9 6QW****Erection of extensions and alterations****Date Responded: 08/07/2025****Responding Officer: JD****Responding Ref: 01/96**

There are some trees protected under TPO 01/96 to the west of the property.

A Tree Preservation Order is an order made by a local planning authority in England to protect specific trees, groups of trees or woodlands in the interests of amenity. An [Order prohibits](#) the:

- cutting down
- topping
- lopping
- uprooting
- wilful damage
- wilful destruction

of trees without the local planning authority's written consent. If consent is given, it can be subject to conditions which have to be followed. In the Secretary of State's view, cutting roots is also a prohibited activity and requires the authority's consent.

None of the TPO'd trees will be impacted upon from any of the proposed work.

There is minor infringement into the RPA of T004. This is not a protected tree and the proposed new paving within the RPA is so minimal there will be little to no impact on the trees future viability.

The proposals look largely achievable with no impact on the retained trees and the tree protection fencing is adequate to prevent any damage to the trees during construction.
