Subject: consultation response 2025/91939 White Cross Farm, Ash Lane, Emley

A heritage statement has been submitted with the application and based on this, it is considered that, whilst the outbuilding provides evidence of the phased construction of the farm buildings at White Cross and retains comparatively early fabric, historic interest and evidential value is low. Architectural interest has been largely compromised through later alterations, particularly to the principal east facing elevation and this is further diminished by the structural condition of the retained fabric. As such, the contribution of the outbuilding to the significance of the main range buildings is very limited and no archaeological works are currently recommended.
