As a direct neighbour of 17 Far View Crescent, I strongly object to the latest application for the children's home.

Having read through all the supporting information nothing much has changed in this application apart from a half hearted attempt at a parking policy and a design and access statement which has the wrong address and obviously been copied and pasted from a different application.

Whilst out on the crescent I've been approached a few times by worried elderly residents. These old folk have lived here many years and again for the fourth time have anxiety and stress over this. Not to mention my own children and the residents in general. No one is exactly sure how many children it's for as the information is contradictory.

Clearly this is a small community which will be impacted massively if the application is successful.

The parking policy states car sharing will be encouraged but realistically what are the chances that the staff will come from the same areas, highly unlikely I imagine.

It goes on to say there will be no parking directly outside no 17, which would be on their side of the road, leaving all the rest of the crescent as "fair game" for staff visitors, and contractors etc to park. All they have done is stated there is an eight meter no parking zone outside the children's home (space for 2 cars)

This will leave the rest of the crescent chock a block with vehicles associated to the children's home, creating not only emergency highways issues but ill feeling with neighbours, who can't park near their homes.

Who externally polices this policy? nobody, so it's only the applicants word this would actually happen?

There is also mis-leading information regarding the garage parking, which states space for 2 cars but according to the estate agents brochure it was adapted to create a bedroom and is only for storage.

After reading the support information which is ambiguous, vague and contradictory, I'm in no doubt that it provides no extra reassurance to support the application.

Undoubtedly not only the character of the building will change but the whole neighbourhood if the application is approved.

I'm sure the council planning officers will see through all the holes in this latest application and see to refuse
