The KIRKLEES COUNCIL hereby give notice that LISTED BUILDING CONSENT has been granted for the execution of the works referred to:-

LISTED BUILDING CONSENT FOR CHANGE OF USE AND INTERNAL ALTERATIONS TO DWELLING (C3) TO FORM SUPPORTED LIVING ACCOMMODATION (C2) (WITHIN A CONSERVATION AREA)

At: 2, MOUNT, EDGERTON ROAD, EDGERTON, HUDDERSFIELD, HD3 3AE

In accordance with the plan(s) and applications submitted to the Council on 29-Jul-2025 subject to the condition(s) specified hereunder:-

1. The development shall be begun within three years of the date in which this consent is granted.

Reason: Pursuant to Section 18(1) of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990, as amended by the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004.

2. The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in complete accordance with the plans and specifications schedule listed in this decision notice except as may be specified in the conditions attached to this permission, which shall in all cases take precedence.

Reason: To ensure the satisfactory appearance of the development on completion to retain the significance of the designated heritage asset and to accord with Policy LP35 of

the Kirklees Local Plan, as well as Chapter 16 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

3. Any new ventilation, extraction or associated pipework shall utilise existing systems where practicable, or shall be routed to the side, rear or roof (using a ventilation slate), to minimise the impact on the principal front elevation. Full details of the proposed system, including the type, location and appearance of any components, shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority prior to installation. The works shall thereafter be carried out in full accordance with the approved details.

Reason: To ensure any new ventilation or extraction systems are appropriately designed and sited to preserve the special architectural and historic interest of the Grade II Listed Building, in accordance with Policies LP24 and LP35 of the Kirklees Local Plan and Chapter 16 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

4. Notwithstanding the submitted details, the proposed new stud partition walls shall be installed such that they do not damage, obstruct, or cut into any historic fabric, including decorative plasterwork, cornices, and ceiling roses. The new partitions shall be set back from the historic cornices and scribed to fit, so that the intervention remains entirely reversible.

Reason: To protect and preserve the special architectural and historic interest of the listed building and its internal features, in accordance with Policies LP 24 and LP35 of the Kirklees Local Plan and Chapter 16 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

5. All original historic features within the building, including fireplaces, cornices, ceiling roses, skirting boards, decorative plasterwork, joinery, and built-in cupboards, shall be retained in situ and protected during works. No removal, covering, or alteration of these features shall take place unless approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority.

Reason: To safeguard the buildings internal character and features of architectural and historic interest, in accordance with Policies LP 24 and LP35 of the Kirklees Local Plan and Chapter 16 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

Digital Infrastructure: Fibre To The Property (FTTP)

Access to affordable and reliable broadband is necessary for Kirklees' residents, businesses, and visitors to take advantage of the growing digital economy and 'digital by default' services. Fibre optic cables direct to a property (FTTP) is the most reliable way of delivering high speed broadband connectivity and allows for gigabit internet speeds. Access to high quality digital infrastructure provides the foundations for, amongst other things:

- Economic prosperity – workforces that are digitally-literate enables business to thrive.
- Digital literacy – digital literacy and skills increase employability and people can exploit the internet for transactional, social, entertainment and learning purposes.
- New services – digital delivery can lower costs and provide innovative public and health services more conveniently.

It is therefore advised that digital infrastructure, including FTTP, and its benefits for the development be considered from the earliest feasible stage. Methods include working with Internet Service Providers to install digital infrastructure alongside other utilities or providing pre-infrastructure allowing for speeder installation at a later date.

Note: The provision of fibre infrastructure is often available from certain telecommunications providers free of charge for development over a certain scale, provided that sufficient notice is given. Notice periods are typically at least 12 months prior to first occupation. In some cases, providers may request a contribution from the developer.

Note: Where no telecommunications provider has been secured to provide fibre infrastructure by the time of highway construction, it is advised that additional dedicated telecommunications ducting is incorporated alongside other utilities to enable the efficient and cost effective provision of fibre infrastructure in the future.

Where the application has been publicised by notice(s) in the vicinity of the site. It is respectfully requested that the notice(s) now be removed and responsibly disposed of to avoid harm to the appearance of the area

If the applicant is aggrieved by the decision of the Local Planning Authority to refuse listed building consent for the proposed works, or to grant consent subject to conditions, he/she may, by notice served within six months of the date of issue of this notice, appeal to the Secretary of State for the Environment in accordance with Sections 20-21 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990. Appeals must be made using a form which you can get from the Secretary of State at Temple Quay House, 2 The Square, Temple Quay, Bristol BS1 6PN (Tel: 0303 444 5000) or online at <https://www.gov.uk/appeal-planning-decision> Further information on the Planning Appeal process can be found online at the Planning Inspectorates website <https://www.gov.uk/government/organisations/planning-inspectorate>. You must use the correct Planning Appeal Form when making your appeal. If requesting forms from the Planning Inspectorate, please state the type of application that the appeal relates to so they can send you the appeal form you require. The Secretary of State has power to allow a longer period for the giving of a notice of appeal and he will exercise his power in cases where he is satisfied that the applicant has deferred the giving of notice because negotiations with the Local Authority in regard to the proposed works are in progress.

Please note, only the applicant possesses the right of appeal.
