Comments

The application form states that the variation relates to the proposed site layout and house types.

From the DAS (page 5), I note that additional side windows have been introduced to dwellings on key corners to create a dual aspect, maximise natural surveillance and avoid blank gables. This is certainly supported from a crime reduction perspective.

I have reviewed the Proposed Site Layout plan (Ref: 1187-EA-A-P101-B) dated 14.07.25- site layout and boundary treatments are acceptable. All bin store areas and cycle sheds are located in secure gardens. Parking areas are overlooked.

Landscaping proposal reviewed (Drawing No 4207/1 dated 28 Jul 25)- acceptable.

House types reviewed- no concerns, all acceptable. However, I cannot locate a drawing for house type 455 (plot 66 and 83) amongst the submitted documents.
