Details of the pre-application advice received

Overall positive to the development as it falls into Policy LP7 of the Kirklees Local Plan which encourages the efficient use of previously developed land in sustainable location with good access to local bus services and local conveniences. With regards to the council's five-year land supply the titled balance in favour of sustainable development applies.

There were comments with regard to the dimensions of the internal garage, highways, parking, access to bins which have all been resolved. Environmental health have no air quality concerns. The land is identified as potentially contaminated which we will would look to defer on this application if possible as the previous business was a body shop and not a general garage ie: motor repair or maintenance.

Due to the proximity of the railway and commercial activity, a noise impact assessment would be required in future.
