Officer Report

Site Description

Dewsbury Railway Station is a Grade II listed building and was constructed for the London & North-Western Railway Company in 1848 with later extensions and alterations. It is located within the Dewsbury Town Centre Conservation Area, with the platforms extending beyond the conservation area boundary.

The site consists of the main two-storey station building, with the former waiting rooms, now the West Riding Public House attached at the southern end. Within the station are two platforms, 1 (to Leeds) and 2 (to Huddersfield). These are connected by a footbridge which was constructed in the 1880's. A sloping ramp leads from Platform 1 up to Milton Walk to the north-west, which is within the conservation area.

Description of Proposal

The application is seeking Listed Building Consent for the renewal of three existing Help Points. The existing Help Points are located adjacent to the ticket office, on platform 1 and on platform 2.

The existing Help Points are proposed to be replaced with state-of-the-art technology to replace the existing equipment which is towards the end of its life-cycle.

The location of the Help Points would be retained as existing with the intention of the works being to enhance information available to customers in order to increase the sense of reassurance and security of travelling by train. The proposed Help Points connect directly to call centres by two dedicated '*call buttons*'. The first call button will connect to an operator, who is able to provide train running information. The second call button is intended for use in an emergency to summon assistance as appropriate (as stated within the submitted Design and Access Statement). Additional benefits include lower operational and maintenance costs.

No negotiations have taken place with the applicant/agent due to the application being acceptable in its submitted format.

Representations

We are currently undertaking the legal statutory publicity requirements, as set out at Table 1 in the Kirklees Development Management Charter. As such, we have publicised this application via site notice and newspaper advertisement.

Final publicity date expired 16th October 2025 – no representations received

Consultation Responses

K.C Conservation and Design – informal comments – conditions requested with regards to non-ferrous fixings into mortar joints or existing holes where possible and the repair of holes with natural lime mortar or matching stone.

Policy

The building is Grade II listed and therefore Section 16(2) of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 (as amended) applies. This requires the Local Planning Authority to 'have special regard to the desirability of preserving the building or its setting or any features of a special architectural or historic importance which it possesses'.

Kirklees Local Plan

The statutory Development Plan for Kirklees is the Local Plan (adopted 27th February 2019). The following policies are considered relevant to this application:

- LP1 – Achieving Sustainable Development
- LP2 – Place Shaping
- LP24 – Design
- LP35 – Historic Environment

National Policies and Guidance:

National planning policy and guidance is set out in National Policy Statements, primarily the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) published December 2024, the Planning Practice Guidance Suite (PPGS) first launched 6th March 2014 together with Circulars, Ministerial Statements and associated technical guidance.

The NPPF constitutes guidance for local planning authorities and is a material consideration in determining applications.

- Chapter 2 – Achieving sustainable development
- Chapter 12 – Achieving well-designed places
- Chapter 16 – Conserving and enhancing the historic environment

Assessment

Dewsbury Railway Station is a Grade II building with the proposal seeking Listed Building Consent for the renewal of three existing help points.

The works would be in the same location as the existing Help Points which would be replaced with state-of-the-art technology with similar enhancements to station Help Points being made throughout the TransPennine Express Franchise Network.

The existing posts and fixings of the Help Points would be cleaned, painted and re-used wherever practical. However, should new posts or fixings be required, details have been submitted on drawing numbers 6, 7 and 8.

The submitted Design and Access Statement goes on to state that...*'Where new fixings are required and the existing fabric of the building has already been penetrated, damage to masonry will be first made good to a high standard by a qualified mason before the installation of new equipment commences. New holes will then be made to accommodate revised fixings in the face of the blockwork avoiding damage to the edges of the blocks themselves and disturbing the mortar.'*

As such, a condition shall be added to the decision notice to ensure that any new fixings shall be non-ferrous and to be fixed into joints where practicable and also that any old fixings shall be removed and any holes left shall be filled with lime mortar to match the colour of the stone.

Summary

The proposed works have been considered to minimise the harm to the significance of the host listed building by sensitive design and ensuring that the works can be reversed. The proposal is therefore considered to be acceptable.

Other matters:

On 12th November 2019, the Council adopted a target for achieving 'net zero' carbon emissions by 2038, with an accompanying carbon budget set by the Tyndall Centre for Climate Change Research. National Planning Policy includes a requirement to promote carbon reduction and enhance resilience to climate change through the planning system and these principles have been incorporated into the formulation of Local Plan policies. The Local Plan pre-dates the declaration of a climate emergency and the net zero carbon target, however it includes a series of policies which are used to assess the suitability of planning applications in the context of climate change. When determining planning applications the Council will use the relevant Local Plan policies and guidance documents to embed the climate change agenda.

The proposed alterations are for the replacement of Help Points within Dewsbury Railway Station. Overall, the proposal would have limited impact on climate change however this is outweighed by the public benefits of the scheme.

Conclusion:

Section 66 (1) of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 requires, that in considering whether to grant planning permission for development which affects a listed building or its setting, the local planning authority or, as the case may be, the Secretary of State shall have special regard to the desirability of preserving the building or its setting or any features of special architectural or historic interest which it possesses.

Section 72 (1) requires that with respect to any buildings or other land in a conservation area, special attention shall be paid to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of that area.

Overall, the proposed works are modest in scale and are sensitively designed to integrate with the existing structure where practically possible. As such, they are considered to preserve the character and appearance of the listed building.

The National Planning Policy Framework gives consideration to the works that would impact the historic environment and states the following:

Paragraph 212:

'When considering the impact of a proposed development on the significance of a designated heritage asset, great weight should be given to the asset's conservation (and the more important the asset, the greater the weight should be). This is irrespective of whether any potential harm amounts to substantial harm, total loss or less than substantial harm to its significance.'

With paragraph 215 continuing on to state:

'Where a development proposal will lead to less than substantial harm to the significance of a designated heritage asset, this harm should be weighed

against the public benefits of the proposal including, where appropriate, securing its optimum viable use.'

The proposed works are considered to preserve the special architectural and historic interest of the Listed Building through the retention of historic fabric, use of sympathetic materials, and the sensitive restoration works where required.

The proposal therefore aligns with paragraph 212 & 215 of the NPPF. It is considered that the proposed development would sustain the significance and not result in harm to the setting or character of the listed building.

Conditions:

1. The development shall be begun within three years of the date in which this consent is granted.

Reason: Pursuant to Section 18(1) of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990, as amended by the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004.

1. The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in complete accordance with the plans and specifications schedule listed in this decision notice, except as may be specified in the conditions attached to this permission, which shall in all cases take precedence.

Reason: For the avoidance of doubt as to what is being permitted and to ensure the satisfactory appearance of the development on completion, and to accord with Policy LP24 & LP35 of the Kirklees Local Plan, and the aims of the National Planning Policy Framework.

2. New fixings shall be non-ferrous and to be fixed into joints where practicable. **Reason:** To ensure the satisfactory appearance of the development on completion to retain the significance of the designated heritage asset and to accord with Policy LP35 of the Kirklees Local Plan, as well as Chapter 16 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

3. Any old fixings shall be removed. Any holes left from removal of old fixings to be filled using an appropriate lime mortar to match the colour of stone.

Reason: To ensure the satisfactory appearance of the development on completion to retain the significance of the designated heritage asset and to accord with Policy LP35 of the Kirklees Local Plan, as well as Chapter 16 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

NOTE: To minimise noise disturbance at nearby premises it is generally recommended that activities relating to the erection, construction, alteration, repair or maintenance of buildings, structures or roads shall not take place outside the hours of 07.30 and 18.30 hours, Mondays to Fridays 08.00 and 13.00hours, Saturdays, with no working Sundays or Public Holidays. In some cases, different site-specific hours of operation may be appropriate.
