| <p>I am strongly objecting to the proposal due to the impact on the village and it's infrastructure, damage to the environment and direct impact from increased traffic. We live on The Knowle and are already impacted by the Vivley Living development. The number of proposed dwellings will increase the traffic onto The Knowle which is already under pressure due to the heavy vehicle use. However I am more concerned about the environmental impact, by changing from farming to a housing complex will not only impact the bat, bird and mammel species currently supported by traditional farming techniques but also the nature of the village will be irrevocably altered. Shepley is currently a rural area, but this new housing development in addition to all the existing new builds will turn it into an urban suburb. Our children and grandchildren have attended the local school, but the increase in population will result in a village scholl unable to cope with demand, our youngest grandchild should not have to struggle to gain a place and quality of education his sisters and mother have had.
