<p>I would like to register my objection to the above planning application for 110 houses off Eastfield in Shepley. I live on Stonecroft Gardens in Shepley and have concerns about a number of aspects of this development.</p> <p>The proposed changes to the roads will impact directly on me. Currently when leaving my road I always exit onto the A629 via the Knowle and have done so since my car slid into the main road when coming down Lea Drive due to the steepness of Lea Drive and I was fortunate that at the time there was no traffic coming along the main road. As this road has got busier, I am worried that if my car slid again I would be at risk of an accident if I had to use Lea Drive.</p> <p>This planning application, if approved, would see me unable to exit via the Knowle as the proposal is to make Knowle Park Ave a one way street. I and many of the elderly residents here on the estate would be effectively unable to safely exit the estate. I think that this would be entirely unacceptable.</p> <p>I am also concerned about the potential disastrous impacts on Shepley Spring, which is a good local employer who employ around 130 people locally. The company is a greatly valued local business that is supportive of all types of community activities in the village and many of the employees live locally. If the water source was contaminated by this development this could have catastrophic effect on the businesses and could even lead to the end of the business here in Shepley. I do not think that the developer should be able to put at risk the water source in this way.</p> <p>I would also like to express my concern about the lack of adequate school places at our local schools that these additional houses would undoubtedly create. Whilst it may be difficult to assess this accurately it is clear that the First school could not accommodate an increase of so many pupils.</p>
