<p>I wish to object to this development in the stongest possible terms on numerous grounds:-</p> <p>The proposed access and egress is unviable, entrance via the Knowle for all traffic is extreemly dangerous, at the moment this blind corner with single track road and only one footpath, it is used regularly by HGVs accessing Shepley Spring and BGM plastics and residents. Living close to this junction I regularly see near misses and hear horns and traffic holdups, with vehicles having to reverse onto the main trunk road. To exacipate this there is a bus stop also at the end where children catch school buses. The Knowle forms part of the Kirklees way and is also an extension of the local bridal path, in summer particularly, many walkers, dogs and horses use this narrow access. Egress via Lea Drive is also extreemly dangerous, particularly under ICY conditions, being a steep hill directly onto the main trunk road, HGVs would find difficulty manouvering at this junction. Many local residents and school run vehicles do not use this route under these conditions and instead go via the Knowle, under the proposals this would no longer be an option, thus putting further pressure on an already dangerous hill/junction.</p> <p>Because of very poor public transport links and lack of post office/supermarkets ect an additional 200+ vehicle will be using these routes several times daily making local black spots even more dangerous.</p> <p>At present there are several housing developments within Shepley/Shelley, the area is well supplied with future housing, any futher development would destroy the village and it's character. Green belt land should be just that, and not lost for future generations</p>
