

Fireplace

The submitted photographs show the removal of the previous 1980s fireplace and the reinstatement of the original inglenook. The old fireplace was not sympathetic to the historic character of the property and, following assessment by a qualified gas heating engineer, was deemed unsafe for continued use. During the works, modern materials—including tiles and a breeze block infill (visible in one of the images)—were carefully removed to reveal the original stone fireplace. The stone was exposed with care to avoid any damage to the historic fabric, and no alterations were made beyond uncovering what was already in place. The reinstated inglenook has been fitted with a compliant multi-fuel stove, providing a feature that is both safe and far more appropriate to the age and character of the listed building.
