Description	The proposal is for erection of single storey rear extension. The extension projects 4.36m beyond the rear wall of the original dwellinghouse. The maximum height of the extension is 3.35m, the height of the eaves of the extension is 2.86m

OFFICER RECOMMENDATION

DISCHARGE OF CONDITION A.4 , SCHEDULE 2, PART 1, CLASS A GENERAL PERMITTED DEVELOPMENT ORDER

1. Procedural Matters

Prior notifications for the erection of single storey rear extensions to dwellings are considered against the requirements as set out by the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development)(England) Order 2015 (as amended) Schedule 2, Part 1, Class A, condition A.4.

Proposals pursuant to Class A are permitted subject to limitations set out in paragraph A.1 and in the case of Class A.1 (g) subject to the discharge of condition A.4. This proposal relates to development pursuant to Class A where condition A.4 is engaged and for the purposes of this assessment only the limitations for Class A.1 (g) and requirements of condition A.4 are considered. Other limitations within Class A are not considered other than where, in the opinion of the Local Planning Authority, the development does not comply with the limitations within Class A of the Order. Ultimately the responsibility to ensure the development is carried out in full accordance with any planning permission rests with the applicant or property owner/occupier.

The application form states that the proposed enlargement would project 4.36 metres from the rear wall of the original dwellinghouse. However, when taking into account the existing two-storey rear extension, the total projection of the proposal would be approximately 7.8 metres from the

	original rear wall of the dwelling.

Condition A.4

As part of the notification procedure, the Local Planning Authority notify owners or occupiers of adjacent premises of the proposed development by serving notice and allowing 21 days for objections to be made. The Local Authority shall take into account any representations made as a result of the notice given.

1. Objections

1.1 Summary of representations: -None received

1. Assessment

The property's planning history and aerial imagery shows that a two-storey extension has been erected to the rear elevation. This extension is present on aerial imagery dated 2000 held by the Council and is not present on historic imagery dated 1955 and 1922, indicating it is not an original rearward projection. The proposed single storey rear extension projecting further from the existing enlargement would therefore adjoin a two-storey enlargement.

Sub- paragraph (ja) of Class A, Part 1, Schedule 2 of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development)(England) Order 2015(as amended) provides that where proposed enlargements adjoin an existing enlargement to the original dwellinghouse then both the existing and proposed enlargement are to be considered as one enlargement for the purposes of assessing subparagraphs (e) to (j). In this instance, the combined two and single storey enlargements would have more than one storey and project 7.8 metres from the rear of the dwellinghouse and be within 2 metres of the boundary with an eaves height in excess of 3 metres contrary to subparagraphs (h) & (i).

2. Recommendation

Refusal.

The proposed enlargement does not benefit from a general planning permission under Article 3(1) and Class A, Part 1, Schedule 2 of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development)(England) Order 2015(as amended) as the proposed enlargement adjoins an existing two storey enlargement to the original dwellinghouse where the combined two and single storey enlargements would have more than one storey and project more than 3 metres from the rear of the original dwellinghouse and be within 2 metres of the boundary with an eaves height in excess of 3 metres contrary to sub-paragraphs (h), (i) and (ja) of Class A.
