Subject: Planning application 2025/92913

We object to the above application in line with points already made in our complaint first made in July 2024 (COMP/24/0346). Supplemented by further evidence provided following observations made over the following year.

These points covered our concerns over actual activity observed at 393 Bradford Road and included:

- multiple parked vehicles stretching from York Avenue to well beyond our property during times of religious celebration and teaching, blocking access to other properties and encroaching the pavement;
- unregulated attempts at traffic management, including the use of traffic cones;
- large groups congregating around the property causing further congestion, noise and litter;
- disregard of our attempts to raise concerns with organisers and disrespectful attitudes by attendees to our right to expect courteous behaviour in a domestic space;
- large scale outside-catering in the rear garden, causing further litter and the appearance of rats;
- the building of a large outside structure at the rear of the property to extend the capacity for meetings and ceremonies, with further noise and congestion.
- intrusive religious ceremonies, involving loud singing and music. At one point including the parading of a horse between our properties;
- large groups of children attending religious education, with unknown safeguarding and fire safety precautions.

The latest acknowledgment of our complaint was received from Jessica Irwin on 15/10/2025.

Photographic evidence was contained in the Correspondence provided during the period of our complaint and further evidence can be shared when required.
