<p>I strongly object to this nursery being converted into a form of accommodation.</p> <p>As a professional working in healthcare, the use of this nursery has been extremely beneficial for my family and child, I have had the opportunity to return to work whilst my child and other young babies and children have been cared for in this nurturing environment. The level of flexibility provided by Early Years at Shape has meant that I have been able to return back to my career without it being affected or impacted on.</p> <p>There are staff in jobs alongside parents and families in the local community who use this service for holidays, mornings, afternoons and evening sessions. There are not very many nurseries within the locality that provide children with a great learning foundation like they do here. The loss of this will impact negatively on staff, children and working families hence the strong objection. I struggle to understand the benefit of the building being converted to an accommodation. This does not outweigh the benefits of an educational facility. For families, it's highly stressful to find somewhere new for their children once they are thriving in this environment and will result in children being placed on long waiting lists which in turn will affect our working jobs and place unnecessary levels of stress and anxiety in the community.</p> <p>This nursery is within walking distance and the care, support and foundation provided to my child alongside many others has made the children thrive and in a good place for setting foot into school.</p> <p>I strongly disagree with the new plan and object to the conversion. It is essential for the nursery to remain open so that parents and staff can remain in jobs, continue to care for and support many children and so that it doesn't impact on the community negatively.</p>
