I wish to submit my utmost objection to the application for the following reasons :-  
It has been clearly and comprehensively demonstrated by the three previous objectors and objections made against the previous application that the application is totally unacceptable.

1. The application has been shown to be misleading, inaccurate and to a certain extent false in that information has been left unanswered either by design or incompetence.

2. The only significant change to the previous application is that they have relocated the building across the road and that will have no significant effect on the objections raised previously.

3. The design does not meet the requirements for commercial enterprises for egg production or farming livestock. ie; retention of contamination within the building both during egg production and periodic cleaning and decontamination due to the absence of solid floors and bunded access.

There are no means of decontamination or control to keep the livestock in and diseases out.

There are no means or method statements as to how contaminated waste, carcasses and damaged eggs are to be disposed of, contaminants including disinfectants, ammonia and high levels of nitrates. Also higher levels of methane production.

No means stated regarding dust control, the design indicates a hit and miss cladding design allowing the prevailing wind to blow through and also allows small birds to access the building thus compromising biosecurity.

The water course is still a significant factor.

It does not indicate the form of sustainable drainage they intend to install.

The access will have to be modified to allow feed delivery and waste removal, ie a suitable hard standing , scraping off the topsoil and laying 75mm of hardcore is totally inadequate.

The location will no doubt change again due to the proximity of overhead power cables, I doubt whether they would wish to go to the expense of having the power cables relocated.

4. The application does not comply with the Local Planning Plan.

5. It does not add to the biodiversity of the area.

6. It does mean a loss of amenity.

7. It does add to the overall nitrate saturation of the area when added to the beef production on Slades Road, and an estimated 300 sheep which are regularly rotated between the neighbouring fields.

8. The local farm shop has well established supply chains for their eggs.

9. Finally, the Environment agency did not support the previous application, so in view of the fact that there are no fundamental changes i cannot see why they should support this application. It should be refused on this basis alone and stop wasting planners time, efforts and costs.
