



My husband and I have lived in the village for many years and we are dismayed by the scale and site of this development. Adding over 120 houses in to a village of just over 300 houses would completely change the nature of the village and would add considerably to traffic and congestion in the village.

Carr Hill Road has transformed from a quiet residential road into a cut through in recent years due to the volume of traffic on Barnsley road. This situation will only worsen with the recent Bromley Quarry approval. The village has a significant older population and road safety is becoming a real topic of concern for this group.

The countryside around the village is highly valued by all the residents and it forms an important agricultural asset and ecosystem for many birds, animals and protected trees. Local travel infrastructure in terms of buses and trains is poor and so most journeys made by new residents will be in cars. Given that employment centres are many miles away this will add significantly to the commuter traffic on the local roads. Surely it makes more sense to locate new housing nearer to employment centres?

Local amenities have been worsening for several years and it is challenging to get a doctors appointment locally and the post office has significant queues. Water issues locally have been a major issue with pressure challenges and regular repairs being required to infrastructure on Barnsley road. I do not believe that we could cope with 120 more houses adding to these problems

Overwhelming small village communities with this scale of development is a recipe for disaster.
