<p>Shocked...I walk 3 days per week with my dog from upper Denby through the woods and then into Stephen's Wood...the ancient woodland...I'm heartbroken and disgusted about the fact that planning is being proposed to build right next to the ancient woodland which is also filled with Neolithic buildings...outrageously they want to build within 10m??? NATIONAL STANDARD IS 50m, including in most of Yorkshire....this will cause severe damage to an ecosystem that Kirklees recognise as vital. The field itself at the minute has sheep and winter food for them growing...it's being farmed. It is greenbelt. It was made greenbelt to protect these places.</p> <p>I then take my life into my own hands and walk back on Barnsley Road which is already dangerous due to footpaths and trees etc etc....the developers traffic survey uses the nonsense figure of 1.5 cars per house....that is national. I strongly object to this figure. It is very easy for anyone to find that HD8 (and its no surprise is it) has car ownership is at 2.5 per house on average...this makes a mockery of their car movement. You can reckon on 500 car movements plus per day..on a road that's already dangerous and with black spot cross roads in it. The ecology report makes no mention of animals.
