

I strongly object to this application.

- * The village drainage and sewers system is at capacity.
- * The village shares amenities with its rural neighbours. The GP, Dentist & local schools are all over subscribed.
- * Our public transport links are limited.
- * Traffic has increased. Bromley Farm Quarry were granted an application which increased the number of wagons leaving their site. The entrance is onto Barnsley Road.
- * The village cannot sustain an additional 123 homes.
- * A 123 house development on Green Belt land goes against the Kirklees Local Plan. That in itself should be enough to not even consider this application.
- * The proposed development is on arable land that sheep are grazing on.
- * The development would be adjacent to recognised Ancient woodland which is home to a large variety of birds, deer, bats and hairy ants.
- * A Tree Preservation Order is in place on this proposed development site. Although the Order covers 1 tree specifically it should be noted that the woodland trees have been in situ since the 1600's
- * The land proposed for development has not been identified as building land by Kirklees Council.
- * Currently there are still designated areas of brownfield and grey available for development within Kirklees.
- * The ecological impact and damage ,in developing the proposed site , will be irreversible. Contamination from the site, run off water and foul water going into the woodland habitat must be seriously considered.
