This is further objection from my teenage child.

I am a teenager and I live near the site for planning application 2025/60/93572/E. I would like to formally object to this proposal.

One of the main reasons I am objecting is because of the ancient woodlands near the site. I have grown up playing in these woods. They are really special to me and to lots of other young people in the area. We build dens, explore, walk our dogs, and just spend time outside. It's one of the only places where we can be in nature without having to travel far.

If this development goes ahead, I am scared that the woods will be ruined. Even if they are not completely cut down, building so close to ancient woodland can damage it through pollution, noise, extra people, and disruption to wildlife. Ancient woodland has existed for hundreds of years, once it is damaged, it cannot simply be replaced. You cannot recreate something that old.

I am also worried about the impact on animals that live there. There are birds, insects and small mammals that depend on this habitat. If the area is built on, their homes could be destroyed.

As teenagers, we already don't have many safe outdoor places to go. Losing access to these woods would take away a space that is important for our mental health, exercise, and freedom. It feels unfair that something so valuable could be lost.

I understand that development can be important, but I believe ancient woodland should be protected, especially for future generations. Once it is gone or damaged, it is gone forever.

For these reasons, I respectfully ask that you refuse planning application 2025/60/93572/E.
