Climate Change Mitigation Measures

Question 1: What measures have been/will be taken to reduce the energy demand associated with your proposed development beyond the minimum required in Building Regulations? (see section 2 of the guidance notes)

- * The building will be air tight and will utilise high quality building materials.
- * All new appliances will be energy efficient.

- * Building materials including the walling stone will be sourced locally, to reduce the need for transport.
- * The existing Building footprint is not being extended and therefore there will be no use of unnecessary materials.
- * Local contractors will be employed to carry out the work.
- * Materials which have a long life span and require little maintenance will be used.
- * Maximise the use of timber from sustainable Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) sources. If other timber is used it will be from a known source with a sustainable purchasing policy.
