I am writing to submit my strongest possible objection to planning application 2026/60/90116/E, currently being considered by Kirklees Council. I am utterly appalled that this proposal has reached this stage. It represents a complete failure to respect local residents, community wellbeing, and environmental responsibility. The permanent destruction of this green space is unacceptable and should never have been entertained. This is not “available land” to be exploited for development — it is a vital space that people depend on for peace, exercise, and mental health. At a time when mental health is openly recognised as a serious national issue, it is disgraceful that this council is considering removing one of the few remaining areas where residents can escape pressure, noise, and overcrowding. Families, elderly residents, and vulnerable individuals rely on this space. Ignoring this reality shows a disturbing lack of care for the people who actually live here. This development will also block my view and significantly reduce natural light to my home, making it darker, more enclosed, and far less pleasant to live in. I did not choose to live in this area only to have my quality of life sacrificed for overdevelopment and short-term financial gain. This application clearly prioritises profit over people, concrete over community, and short-term gain over long-term wellbeing. It demonstrates a refusal to listen to residents and a willingness to damage the character of this area permanently. That is both frustrating and unacceptable. Kirklees Council has a duty to protect residents and green spaces, not destroy them. I expect this damaging and inappropriate proposal to be rejected. Anything less would be a serious betrayal of the community you are meant to serve.
