| <p>Some issues to be aware of:</p> <p>Bin waste: Residents along Water Street currently have to wheel their bins to the top of the main road Co-Op Lane for collection, as the bin wagon no longer comes down Water Street to collect waste. Cars often park at the top of Water Street, which can block access for larger vehicles and even when access is clear the bin wagon generally does not come down to collect bin waste. This may affect waste collection for the new 12 plots accessed via Water Street.</p> <p>Water Street access: Vehicles accessing the Mill via Water Street need to be aware that there is a blind corner at the end of No. 10 when entering or exiting the Mill. As the road is only wide enough for one vehicle at a time, some form of traffic management or safety measure should be considered. The lane is also regularly used by local residents walking their dogs to the river footpath.</p> <p>Road resurfacing: During winter, Water Street can become very icy. If the road is resurfaced, the choice of material should be carefully considered, as standard tarmac may worsen icy conditions. A surface material that provides better grip and reduces the risk of ice should be considered.</p> <p>Construction traffic and parking: During the construction period, contractors should not use the parking spaces at the bottom of Water Street, as parking is already very limited and this could cause disruption for residents. Contractors should also be mindful and considerate of local residents when parking and accessing the area during the works.</p> | |
