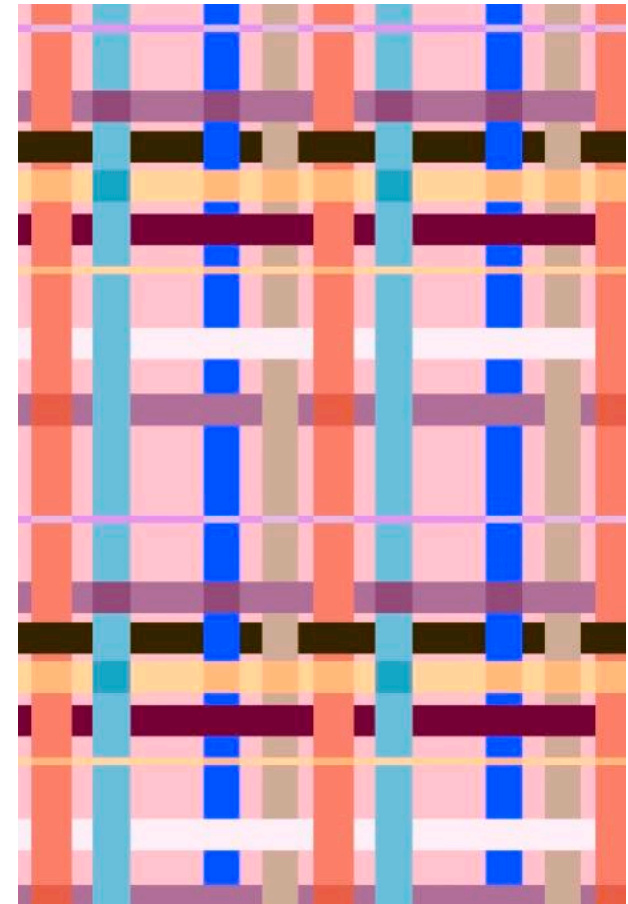
- INITIAL SUGGESTED BUDGET

- 1 door on School Street

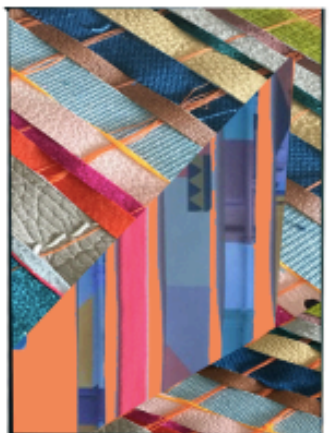
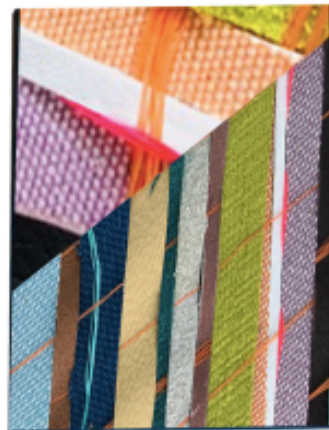
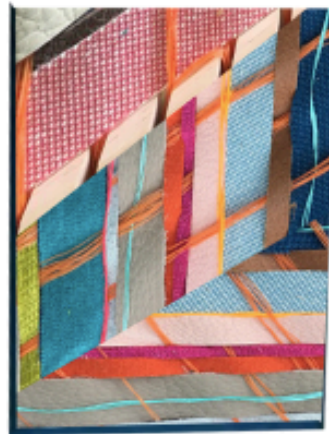


INSPIRATION

6 EXAMPLE DESIGNS + VISUAL 1



Overlapped images in multiple directions to give the effect of a giant loom within the building -

Additional designs similar to this to be created for the other windows on the school street side. Final colours / design may vary slightly.

SUGGESTED SUBSTRATE / FITTING METHOD

Existing window boards are painted OSB with a rope handle. Artwork to be applied either to Dibond or marine ply panels and attached to the existing top and bottom frames of the window board using a screw fitting, allowing for removal.

Lift equipment hire would be required for 1 day for fitting the second and third floor windows.
