

BRIEF AND EXISTING BUILDING/CONTEXT ANALYSIS

Castle Hill School

Castle Hill School is an Academy located in Newsome, Huddersfield, providing education for students aged 3 to 19 with highly complex needs. The school supports pupils with Profound and Multiple Learning Difficulties, Severe Learning Difficulties, and Multi-Sensory Impairments.

The Brief

It is proposed to replace one of the existing windows with an external door to provide access for a pupil with specific needs. The new door will be installed within the existing structural opening, with the frame colour to match the existing windows.

Existing Building Design

The school is a two-storey building with a predominantly buff brick exterior, complemented by feature white rendered bays. An extension constructed from timber is also present. All external windows and doors are finished in a light to mid-grey colour.

Boundaries

The site boundaries will remain unchanged and consist of a secure fenced perimeter. The northern elevation, where the proposed window replacement is located, overlooks a densely wooded area and, as such, the change will have no impact on the public realm.
