The site is within Holmfirth Conservation Area and therefore any trees with a stem diameter over 7.5cm at chest height are protected.

All species currently on the site wouldn't be considered high enough in amenity value to warrant a TPO and therefore their removal to facilitate the development would be deemed acceptable.

There are some more established trees to the rear of the plot which should be retained where possible however they lie outside of the Conservation area.

There would be no objection and no need for further information.
