I have looked at the application for the proposed application for works to the community of the resurrection. No heritage statement has been supplied for the proposed works despite the church which is attached to the accommodation being integral to the site and being a grade II listed building. The Design and access statement for the site does include a short section on Heritage but considering the significance of the whole complex and the relationship between the church and the accommodation on site I would recommend that a full buildings appraisal is required in this case.

This should describe the church and associated buildings, their significance and the impact of the proposed works on the historic buildings and their significance.

Following on from submission of the buildings appraisal it will be possible to produce a full assessment of the building and the impact of the proposed works. This is necessary to determine what if any further archaeological works may be required.

Should any further works be required this can be undertaken by means of a condition to planning approval if required.
