<p>For some reason the Kirklees council planning department seem to be ignoring local community concerns regarding Healey Farm applications In 2017 they applied a didn't get approval, yet in 2024 erected 2 buildings with no consent or approvals - these have been raised with Kirklees on a number of objections In 2025 they applied for a subsequent large unit to be built - after 20 + objections were applied it was granted with certain restrictions see Dew artefact ref 1091295 15th May 2026 The local community has been ignored regarding objections to this planning, the farm does not have the capacity to house livestock to this extent, see Defra regulations and objections in 2025 with calculations, yet approvals have been granted with no further consultation with the community and certainly the local neighbours within 400 metres (which requires full planning approval) NOW applied for further buildings on green belt land besides the ones above - our concerns require answering and a consultation needs to be held with the local community - the owners are simply doing as they please and Kirklees are allowing them! The gate which is a bridle way is controlled from the farm and has restricted access which is certainly not allowed yet again Kirklees don't seem to care The new buildings will create more noise/pollution/ access issues (the road is not suitable for this type of traffic)'ecology and health concerns not just for the livestock but local community (Bristfield beck) not to mention coal shafts below which have already been built upon (2 barns with no permission) We have our homes here and this is damaging values and our social health and well-being Can you Nicola Helliwell answer some of the reasons why the owners are allowed to ruin a community when they simply don't have the land to put all these buildings up or a strong case to gain approval - we want some answers and I speak for a considerable amount of homeowners in the village, why are our objections and concerns being ignored?!</p>
