I have looked at this site again, sorry for the late reply.

The site is in an area where coal mining has been undertaken in the past. At the east end of the site a former coal mine is shown on historic os maps and marked as the West lane Colliery. Additional data from the coal Authority mapping marks two shafts in the central west end of the site. It is not known what colliery these shafts relate too or their date



The coal mining will have impacted on ground conditions with shafts and associated buildings coal and waste storage and transport access. Generally it appears that the archaeological potential of the site will be low due to the presence of past mining activities and no known archaeological remains are recorded on the site on the hbsmr.

Therefore I do not recommend archaeological works are undertaken on the site.
