G5 - Trees growing closely as a group canopy resulting in leggy extended end weighted branches. Ash now removed. Lime has strip wound to 0.5m occluding well Large horse chestnut to East of group (tagged 0942) has one very decayed and extended limb which is starting to collapse, leaving a gap in canopy. Tree is gradually declining, and has extended lateral branches that will be vulnerable. Sycamore to SE of group (tagged 0943) is in serious decline with bark necrosis and bark delamination. Possible sooty bark disease. Half canopy in leaf, half not. Recommend Horse chestnut: Large limb with cavity at base to be shortened back to decayed area, retaining woodpecker habitat but removing weight from base of stem. Crown reduce remainder of tree by 30% canopy volume as per BS3998, shortening end weighted branches. Sycamore: fell to 3m stem and leave for habitat.

T3. Sycamore with previous fire damage. Exposed heartwood now decaying. Bark delamination throughout and dead wood throughout. Tree is 90% dead and collapsing. Fell to 3m stump and retain for wildlife. Marked with white spot.

T10. Suppressed tree under canopy of larger beech. Ivy severed revealing very large area of heartwood decay plus kretzschmaria deusta on dead wood.

Fungus: Kretzschmaria deusta (Brittle Cinder). Fell tree to a 1m stump for wildlife habitat. Caution that canopy branches are entwined in larger tree.

T11. Ash Ivy severed but base still obscured. Open grown canopy with straggly end weighted branches typical of species. Moderate dead wood throughout over road and close to footpath. Only partial basal inspection possible due to ivy. 2024: Ash Dieback Infection Level 1: 0% to 25%. Crown clean removing dead wood over 25mm. Remove ivy around base of tree.
