3. Description of Proposed Works

The proposal comprises the construction of a single-storey contemporary pavilion extension to the garden (East) elevation of Staincliffe Hall, a Grade II listed dwelling, connected to the existing building by a lightweight glazed link. The extension will provide additional family living accommodation, including an open-plan kitchen, dining and living area. The proposal also includes associated internal alterations to facilitate the connection between the existing building and the new extension, together with external landscaping works, hard and soft landscaping, new boundary treatments where required, and all associated drainage and site works. The revised proposal has been reduced in footprint and projection following pre-application consultation to reinforce its subordinate relationship with the listed building and minimise its impact on the significance and setting of the heritage asset

Details of pre-application advice received?

Pre-application advice was sought from Kirklees Council in respect of a proposed contemporary single-storey pavilion extension to the Grade II listed Staincliffe Hall. The Conservation and Design Officer confirmed that the principle of a contemporary extension, connected to the Hall via a lightweight glazed link, was acceptable and that a contemporary architectural approach was appropriate for this heritage asset. The principal concern related to the footprint and projection (Roof) and external stairs of the original proposal, with advice recommending that the extension be reduced to reinforce its subordinate relationship with the listed building and minimise its impact on the significance and setting of the heritage asset. The submitted proposal has been substantially revised in direct response to this advice. The pavilion has been reduced in footprint and projection, resulting in a more subservient form that retains a greater proportion of the landscaped garden setting while preserving the architectural hierarchy and significance of Staincliffe Hall. These revisions are documented within the submitted Design and Access Statement and Heritage Statement.

Removal of the existing window and associated localised alteration to the external wall opening to facilitate the construction of a lightweight glazed link connecting the proposed single-storey pavilion extension to the existing listed building.

Why is it necessary to demolish or extend (as applicable) all or part of the building(s) and or structure(s)?

Removal of the existing window and localised alteration to the existing masonry opening has been selected to provide the connection between the listed building and the proposed pavilion extension, thereby minimising intervention to the historic fabric. By utilising an existing opening, the proposal avoids the need to create a new structural opening within the principal masonry walls, reducing the extent of alteration required to the listed building. The lightweight glazed link has been designed to remain clearly subordinate and reversible, ensuring the significance and integrity of the heritage asset are preserved.

The proposed works comprise limited internal and external alterations to facilitate the construction of a contemporary single-storey pavilion extension connected to the existing Grade II listed building by a lightweight glazed link. Externally, the existing window to the East (garden) elevation will be carefully removed and the existing masonry opening locally adapted to form the connection with the glazed link. The existing stonework surrounding the opening will be retained wherever practicable, with any new structural support integrated within the proposed glazed link. Internally, localised alterations are proposed adjacent to the existing window opening to provide access between the Hall and the new extension. The works have been deliberately confined to an existing opening in order to minimise intervention to the historic fabric and avoid the formation of a new structural opening within the listed building. The proposed works are illustrated on Drawing Nos. [DCC-20-0210 / DCC-20-0211 and within the submitted Design and Access Statement and Heritage Statement. The extent of alteration has been deliberately minimised to preserve the significance of the Grade II listed building, with the new connection formed through an existing window opening to reduce intervention to the historic fabric and maintain the architectural hierarchy of the building
