Allowing another planning request alongside without giving chance for the impact of the the first project to be assessed doesn't make sense2. That little area has become home to lots of wildlife, from birds, fish, geese, foxes etc to more protected species like . No consideration seems to have been given to the impact of this project on that wildlife, nor the impact on the area of losing that wildlife3. Local people get so much pleasure from the wildlife. People regularly wander around edges of the site and enjoy it. It's educational, and it helps people with their mental well-being to be able to enjoy a little greenery and wildlife4. When the mills were on fire, the fire service needed to use the mill ponds for an adequate supply of water to fight the fire. What would happen if they were no longer there?5. The area around Newsome Road, Hart Street and Naomi Road is a busy little area, and parking is often all used up in the evenings. The impact of both the congestion and parking issues with another 22 houses and who knows how many cars would increase the congestion and potentially mean we don't have enough parking for residents6.
