<p>My first objection is the fact that the dams are fed by natural spring water that was diverted from the hills above Newsome by the original mill owners to fill the dams. Apparently the overflow which leads down to the river colne is broken and blocked which explains the fact that as my dwelling is below the dams that my garden and the playing field behind our house has become increasingly wet and my lawn is ruined and has turned into mud. If they fill the dams in i fear for my house foundations due to the extra water that will flow down to us. Apparently Yorkshire water have no objections to this development, have they done a full survey of where the thousands of gallons water will go when the dams are filled in, if so I would like a copy sent to me, my email is _____ and also to my MP Barry Shearman and my local councillor Andrew Cooper. Water can not be stopped it will always flow down hill and we are below the dams. When the mill was on fire in 2016 the fire brigade pumped water out of the dams and they couldn't believe how fast the dams filled back up again, there is a lot of natural water running down the hillside and if the dams are filled in the displaced water will come our way and will consequently ruin my house and my neighbours houses too.</p> <p>My next objection is the wildlife that depends on these dams there are lots of different species of fish in the dams, there is a nesting pair of geese that come back every year, several pairs of ducks a pair of herons and also swifts, swallows, house martins and the most important of all are the bats. There are a lot of different species of bat in this area that roost in the trees and nearby buildings that depend on the dams because that is where the bugs that they eat will be flying over the water. So if there is no water the bats habitat will be ruined and they will die so I insist that their is full survey done by the bat conservation trust. I will send a copy of this to my MP Barry Shearman and my local councillor Andrew Cooper to make sure the survey is done.</p> <p>My next objection is the entrance and exit for motor vehicles accessing the new development, Hart street has cars parked on both sides of the road all day every day so any vehicular movement in or out of a new development will be severely restricted and could potentially cause an accident.</p>
