

KIRKLEES COUNCIL (TRAFFIC REGULATION) (CONSOLIDATION ORDER PROVIDING ON-STREET PARKING PLACES, WAITING, LOADING AND STOPPING RESTRICTIONS AND MIGRATION TO A 'MAP-BASED' FORMAT) ORDER 2024 (AMENDMENT NO. 01) ORDER 2026

WOOD NOOK, EAST HILL WAY, WAKEFIELD ROAD, DENBY DALE

The Council of the Borough of Kirklees propose to make the above Order under their powers in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 the effect of which, as it affects a lengths of road in the Denby Dale area of the Kirklees district, will be to amend the Kirklees Council (Traffic Regulation) (Consolidation Order Providing On-Street Parking Places, Waiting, Loading And Stopping Restrictions and Migration to a 'Map-Based' Format) Order 2024 so as to:

1. Prohibit the waiting at any time on a lengths of the following roads in Denby Dale:

- i. Wakefield Road
- ii. East Hill Way
- iii. Wood Nook

2. Modify the existing restrictions against waiting at any time on a length of Wakefield Road, Denby Dale Road contained in the Kirklees Council (Traffic Regulation) (Consolidation Order Providing On-Street Parking Places, Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions and Migration to a 'Map-Based' Format) Order 2024

REASON: As part of the East Hill Way housing development, the developer proposes to construct a new footway along Wood Nook. This footway will provide an improved and clearly defined pedestrian link to Wakefield Road.

The introduction of the footway will reduce the available carriageway width. Any vehicles parked on Wood Nook would therefore obstruct traffic flow and create a potential hazard for both motorists and pedestrians.

The proposed parking restrictions are considered necessary to maintain safe and unobstructed access for vehicles while enhancing safety for pedestrians using the new footway.

It is believed these restrictions will improve road safety for all road users.
