KIRKLEES COUNCIL EXPERIMENTAL (TRAFFIC REGULATION) (NO. 11a) ORDER 2023 VARIOUS ROADS IN HUDDERSFIELD TOWN CENTRE

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of the Borough of Kirklees has made above Order under their powers in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 the effect of which will be:

- 1. Prohibit driving on Church Street Huddersfield between its junction with John William Street to its junction with Wood Street, and between its junction with Wood Street to its junction with Byram Street for all vehicles at all times.
- 2. Prohibit driving on Wood Street Huddersfield between its junction with St Peter's Street to its junction with Northumberland Street, and between its junction with St Peter's Street to its junction with Kirkgate between the hours of 6pm and midnight on a Thursday, Friday and Saturday for all vehicles except for emergency vehicles.
- 3. Prohibit driving on Byram Street, Huddersfield from its junction with St Peter's Street to its junction with Kirkgate at all times for all vehicles except permit holders, cyclists, disabled badge holders and emergency vehicles and for loading between the hours of 4pm and 10pm.
- 4. To introduce a one-way traffic flow for all vehicles except cyclists on Byram Street, Huddersfield from its junction with St Peter's Street to its junction with Church Street.
- 5. To introduce a one-way traffic flow for all vehicles on St Peter's Street, Huddersfield from its junction with John William Street to its junction with Lord Street
- 6. Revoke items in the following orders, which will be redundant when certain parts of the restrictions referred to above are introduced:
- i. KIRKLEES COUNCIL (TRAFFIC REGULATION) (No.5) ORDER 2004 First Schedule and Third Schedule
- ii. KIRKLEES COUNCIL (TRAFFIC REGULATION) (No.5) ORDER 1999 First Schedule item 3
- iii. WEST YORKSHIRE METROPOLITAN COUNTY COUNCIL (Kirklees)(TR)(No.4) Order 1982 Part 4 article 8

This Order will revoke and replace in its entirety Kirklees Council Experimental (Traffic Regulation) (No 10) Order 2023, which was made but not brought into effect. The provisions of both Orders are identical.

This Order was made on 27 July 2023 and will take effect on 10 August 2023.

The Order will be implemented initially on an experimental basis for eighteen months, during time it will be reviewed. The Council may then make the Order permanent or abandon it.

The Council may vary or modify the Order if it so desires, although no variation or modification may be made after 12 months.

Objections must be sent no later than 10 February 2024 and please ensure you quote reference DEV/HG/D116-2311

If the Order is varied or modified in any way, objections may be received within six months of the variation or modification taking effect.

Any person wishing to challenge the Order on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any requirements of that, or of any instrument made under it, have not been complied with may apply to the High Court within six weeks following 03 August 2023.
