



Consultation on services for children, young people and adults, including people with disabilities

All Age Disability Service







#### Who is this consultation most relevant to?

We welcome the views of anyone who lives, works or studies in Kirklees. However, this consultation will be most relevant to:

- Children, young people and adults with additional needs and disabilities, and their parents and carers
- Children, young people and adults
   who receive social care which involves transportation
- Children, young people and adults whose carers receive respite or short breaks
- Local partners and providers such as schools, nurseries or playgroups

#### This consultation is about three different services:

- 1. Short break opportunities for parents and carers of children with additional or complex needs
- 2. Access to childcare and learning support for 0-4 year olds with special educational needs or disabilities, and for school-age children with special educational needs or disabilities in out-of-school childcare
- **3. Transport** for children, young people and adults to support them in accessing Social Care within their communities, e.g. someone with a disability who goes to a day centre, or a disabled child on a Short Break

We also want to know what's important to people so that we can design the council's overarching offer in a way that makes the biggest difference within the constraints of the budget.

#### Context and overview

In 2016, the Council developed an All Age Disability Service. This service has been developed to enable people to live their lives as independently as possible, whilst making sure that people who need support still get the help they need.

When delivering All Age Disability services, we have committed to following these principles. You can read more about them in our All Age Disability (AAD) Service-Overarching Policy Framework.

#### It describes how we will:

- Adopt a whole-family and a life-long approach
- Value the capacity and strengths of people with a disability
- Work with people with a disability and their families to reshape disability support
- **Provide** the best start in life and focus on early intervention to promote greater independence and prevent family breakdown
- Improve the experience of people with disabilities as they transition into adulthood
- Work in local areas and build strong relationships with people to meet their needs and manage risks effectively
- Make all our processes personalised, flexible, transparent and cost-effective
- Work more closely with our partners and integrate our commissioning where appropriate
- Promote equal access to community opportunities and the full range of universal services

The Council needs to provide support in a way that is affordable within available resources. We have some ideas about how to do this, but we'd like to hear your views before we make any decisions.

This questionnaire has been developed to help the Council design its services and policies for children, young people, adults and their families, including people with disabilities. The funding we have available to support All Age Disability services is outlined in the Council's Medium Term Financial Plan. In some cases, the level of funding available has reduced.

## We want to consult you on these specific areas to understand how we can use the funding we have in the best possible way. This questionnaire includes questions about:

- The services you receive and how valuable they are to you
- How you would like services to be provided in the future
- Rethinking the services we offer, including who is eligible for support
- How we can improve and clarify our policies

### **Short Breaks**

Anyone may respond to this section of the questionnaire, but it is most relevant to the people and families who currently receive Short Breaks / respite or may do so in future.

Kirklees Council provides Short Break and respite opportunities for the parents and carers of children, young people and adults with additional or complex needs. These include fun activities for children and young people. The purpose of arranging these is to assist carers by giving them a break so they can continue to provide care in the long term or do so more effectively.

Kirklees Council has a statutory duty to consult annually to understand whether its current provision is effective, which is why we're consulting this year as well as last year.

The annual Short Breaks consultation has been included as a section in this questionnaire because we expect that many of the people who want to share their views on Short Breaks will also want to share their views on Social Care Transport and the support provided to children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities in their Early Years (the next two sections after this one).

Kirklees Council has a statutory duty to provide Short Breaks for children. We want to make sure that our Short Breaks offer is as effective as possible, so if you, your family or someone you care for use Short Breaks or might use them in future, please help us by answering the questions in the section below.

### Access to childcare and learning support for:

- 0-4 year olds with special educational needs or disabilities
- School-age children with special educational needs / disabilities who use outof-school childcare

Children with special educational needs or a disability often need extra support in the childcare setting, which can cost more. Childcare providers can apply to the Access Fund for additional funding, usually for extra staff, to help these children who may need more support than their peers.

As part of our ongoing work to deliver positive outcomes for our service-users and good value-for-money for the public, we are considering changing the Access Fund. This is the fund which provides financial support to Childcare providers such as nurseries, playgroups and childminders to help them meet the needs of a child with Special Educational Needs and/or Disabilities.

We want your views to inform any changes we make to the Access Fund, so it would be helpful to understand:

- Your priorities when selecting childcare providers
- Which parts of support from the Access Fund (if any) are less valuable to you, your family, or your organisation

We have identified an option which would help the Council meet the needs of children within the resources available:

The Council could limit the funding that the Access Fund provides so it funds enough support to meet our statutory duty, but does not go beyond it.

We currently fund support for some children in excess of what is required by law. We are considering following the example of other local authorities and changing this so that we would only fund support for the hours of national free entitlement to early education and childcare.

This means that childcare providers would only be able to receive support for 3 and 4 year olds and vulnerable 2 year olds. That support would only be available for up to 15 hours per week (or up to 30 hours for 3 and 4 year olds with working parents).

This is likely to save the Council around £130,000 per year.

## Social Care Transport for children, young people and adults

Kirklees Council helps people with assessed social care needs to get about (for example an adult or older person with a disability who goes to a day centre, or a disabled child on a short break).

The Council has no specific statutory duty to provide transport, however we currently choose to provide transport support in specific cases where it is necessary to support people with eligible needs under statute.

We want to implement a new policy, so that:

- We are more transparent with the public and our service-users
- Our decisions around transport are more consistent and equitable across service-users
- We can improve value-for-money for the public

In the future we are looking to assess individuals and their families on a case-by-case basis, so that the council would not necessarily fund transportation if a family is able to make their own arrangements for the transportation themselves.
