IYSS wants to ensure that all children and young people who attend our events and activities have a great time and take part in everything that interests them.

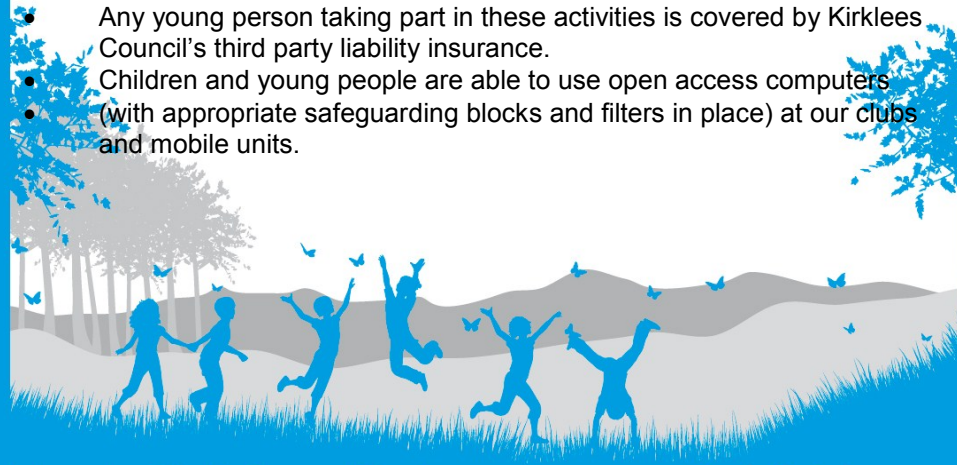
We also give priority to the safety of the children and young people attending all our events, activities and venues. To ensure that we can effectively ensure your safety, all children and young people must register with us.

Registration is free and you only need to register once to take part in any activities run by IYSS across Kirklees throughout the year.

If you are under 16 years of age, you must get your parents/carers to also sign the form.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- IYSS activities are usually open access which means that young people can attend as and when they wish
- Every effort is made to watch over children and young people—They are asked to inform staff when they wish to leave activities—open access schemes allow young people to attend freely. Parent/carers can help make sure children and young people cooperate with staff.
- Parent and guardians still have ultimate responsibility for the whereabouts and behaviour of their children. If you have queries about your child's attendance or behaviour, please speak to the supervisor on site
- Sessions are held at various settings. Some have good facilities and are easily accessed while others may be held in a park, play area, multi court or recreational field. If you have any questions about shelter, access or toilet facilities please contact us.
- Supervision levels on these schemes can be as low as 1 adult to 30 young people. Should any individuals require more care please discuss with the session lead, or contact us
- Any young person taking part in these activities is covered by Kirklees Council's third party liability insurance.
- Children and young people are able to use open access computers (with appropriate safeguarding blocks and filters in place) at our clubs and mobile units.

Integrated Youth Support Service Funding Opportunities 2015-2016
