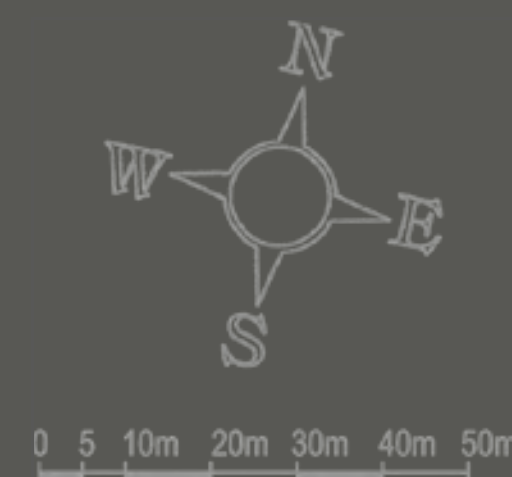

## A brief history

Greenhead Park opened in September 1884, 15 years after the newly-established Huddersfield Corporation took the first steps to buy the land from the Ramsden Estate, then the town's major landowner. An extension to Gledholt Road was opened in 1927, and the Park was fully restored in 2009-11. A plaque on the lodge records the leading part played by Alderman Thomas Denham (1818-92), a town centre shopkeeper, in persuading the Council to buy the Park.

Between 2009 and 2011 the park was fully restored, thanks to funding from Kirklees Council and the Heritage Lottery Fund. Not only did this help restore many features, such as the bandstand and the refreshment rooms, but it also allowed the reintroduction of the ornamental lake and boundary railings.
